Chained Dog Kills

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Police said a bulldog chained in a neighbor's fenced yard apparently killed Mark Paul Dale, 2.

Officers found the mauled body Monday four doors down the street from the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Billy Paul Dale.

Patrolman B. J. Perry said the dead child lay just beyond reach of the animal and "there was blood on the dog's collar and around its mouth."

Perry said the dog, a 3-year-old female, was one of two owned by Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Earl Parker. It was taken to an animal shelter.

The Parkers asked that the dog be destroyed, Perry reported.

"They said it had played with their children frequently and had never even snarled at them," the patrolman said.

Fairfield School

Boy Sent Elsewhere In Derailment Ca

CLEVELAND, Sept. 14 (AP)—A 15-year-old who helped derail a rapid transit train was not sent to the Fairfield School for Boys because "they don't have the facilities down there to teach him anything except how to be a hoodlum," Juvenile Court Judge Walter G. Whitlatch said yesterday.

The judge sent the youth to a private vocational school in Pennsylvania. The youth had a 14-year-old companion who derailed two Cleveland Transit System rapid transit cars A-25 by placing a 75-pound chunk of steel on the tracks.

The 14-year-old, who was in court for the first time, was allowed to continue living at home.
