

## News Bolled Down.

Samuel B. Dillow, of Decatur, Illinois, is missing. Foul play is feared.

J. O. Kelly, of Denver, was arrested at Council Bluffs, Iowa, yesterday, charged with a postal robbery.

The 10-year-old son of H. H. Meyer, a milkman living at Dubuque, Iowa, was fatally bitten by a savage bulldog yesterday.

Henry Sheer, a wealthy farmer living at Millston, Wisconsin, died yesterday from the effects of some poison which he was using in his potato field.

The *Herald*, a democratic paper published at Lawrenceville, Illinois, was purchased yesterday by W. E. McGaughey, who is backed by a number of leading democrats.

Dr. John W. Dinsmore, pastor of the Second Presbyterian church of Bloomington, Illinois, has been called to the pastorate of a Presbyterian church at San Jose, California.

The coroner's jury in the case of the recent accident on the Wisconsin Central railway near Waukesha, Wisconsin, has returned a verdict holding the company responsible for the accident, which is said to have been caused by defective ties.

In the French chamber of deputies yesterday M. Basly, socialist, introduced a bill limiting the working day to eight hours. M. Viger, a member of the tariff commission, moved that the duty on foreign wheat be fixed at 2½ francs and on flour at 6 from May 10 to Dec. 1.

The Mexican government has decided that all ores exported must pay a tax to the mint.

W. S. Tucker, of Little Rock, Arkansas, formerly assistant general passenger and ticket agent of the Little Rock & Memphis railroad, was yesterday arrested on a charge of insanity.
